Computer Department News

- Senior **Audrey Ann Blakely** won the 2013 NCWIT National Runner-Up and the 2013 Philadelphia Area Affiliate awards (ww2.ncwit.org/award). Junior **Caroline Pattillo** won the 2013 Philadelphia Area Affiliate Runner-Up award. The competition recognizes young women at the high-school level for their computing-related achievements and interests. Both girls were honored with about 10 other award winners at a dinner reception at Villanova University on April 3.
- Seniors **Kosho Hoshitsuki, Scott Goldberg, Dakota Lash,** and **Chris Geissler** competed in the Future of Computing Contest (<https://sites.google.com/a/temple.edu/fc2013>) at Temple University on April 13. They won third place and \$250 in the high school division with an Android mobile app named “Project Platoon Fight” that can be used as a framework for other developers to build custom games. All four students are planning to major in computer-related fields in college next year.
- Ninth graders **Jocelyn Dialectos** and **Rohan Rai** and sophomore **Dylan Thomas** competed in the Reading-Berks Science and Engineering Fair (www.rbsef.org) at Albright College Fair on March 12. Jocelyn won second place in the “Zoology” division

with “The Effects of Mimicry on Color of Prey,” Dylan Thomas won second place in the “Mathematics and Computing” division with “Prime Number Computing Solutions.”

- Forty Wyomissing students in grades 7-12 formed teams of five to compete in the wildly popular, first-ever national cyber-security Toaster Wars competition (www.picoctf.com) sponsored by Carnegie Mellon University and the National Security Agency. Wyomissing’s eight teams competed against more than 1,900 teams nationwide. Wyomissing Area’s top team of **Alan Lu, Gavin Babb, Alex Shields, Paul Gehret,** and **Zachary Miller** finished in 314th place. The team of 7th graders (**Sam Botterbusch, Matthew Driben, Andrew Zhou, Joe Cullen,** and **Jack Ambarian**) did phenomenally well beating three of Wyo’s teams of upper-class computer science students and finishing in the top 600 nationally! The National Security Agency promoted the contest because of the country’s dire need to recruit cyber-security experts as it defends itself against constant attacks from terrorists, criminals, and China. Most of the students were addicted to solving the online challenges and can’t wait for the contest next year.
- Junior **Caroline Pattillo** and sophomores **Abby Waxler** and **Katie Cush** traveled to the University of Pennsylvania on April 19, for its annual Women in Computer Science Day. They learned about career and college opportunities in fields such as robotics, digital media, and real-time and embedded computer systems such as pacemakers.

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Carnival Tests Math Skills

Children were seen playing on the West Reading Playground on the last day of May, but it was far from a typical day on the playground. In fact, the students were working hard, putting their math skills to the test. It was the 2nd

annual Math Carnival for the fifth graders at West Reading Elementary Center. **Keith Arnold** and **Erika Homan**, fifth grade math teachers at WREC, worked collectively with a parent committee since November to bring the carnival to life. There were 15 math games for the children to play. Each station was run by at least one parent and involved key math skills the students learned throughout the year.

At any given moment throughout the day, children were seen picking up fuzzy dice with rulers to review multiplication properties, converting fractions

with markers taped to a visor on their head, or carefully moving ping pong balls to the correct place value. Even a faint clicking of the probability wheel could be heard in the distance with a jump for joy when a coupon was won to a local kid-friendly establishment. “We have to thank the parents, the community, and our staff for embracing the idea!” both teachers agree. The foundation for the carnival was set last year by **Carla D’Addesi**, who created most of the games that were used. **Patricia Amin**, **Natalya Spadafora**, and **Jody Menon** went above and beyond to add their own flair to the carnival this year. “The students worked hard all year to master the 5th grade curriculum. The Carnival is a fun way to test their knowledge!” agreed the teachers. **Serafina France-Tribe** had a message for the future 5th graders, “You definitely want to do math carnival. It is a lot of fun!”

For three days in April, fourth grade students had a glimpse of what life was like in colonial days. Participating in six different stations, students made silhouettes and cornbread, practiced calligraphy writing, colonial dancing, and weaving, played games, and experienced a one-room schoolhouse.

Gwen Gibson's students were surprised to learn that meal time in colonial days was much different than today. Colonial children often had to stand for the entire meal and weren't allowed to talk! Meals were very simple and consisted of a lot of corn. Most of the time colonists ate with their fingers rather than utensils.

According to teacher **Nancylee Chaiko**, “The fourth graders were surprised to learn that the professional weavers were men! Both the boys and girls were very proud of the bookmarks that they wove!”

Andrea Boerger said, “The highlight for me as a teacher was watching the excitement on the children's faces as they were learning about colonial times. The costumes and activities really transported them back in time, and it made colonial life and struggles come alive. The kids really loved it!”

Canadian Artifacts Travel to WREC

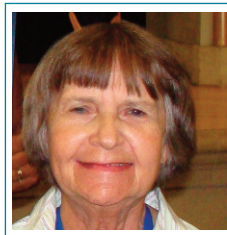

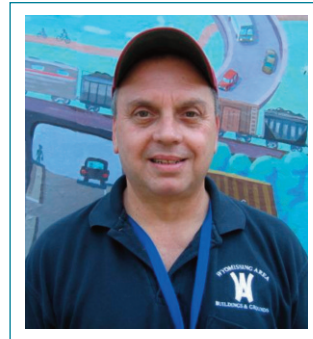

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Wyo 5 Live Club Seeks Needed Upgrades

Wyo 5 Live, founded in November of 1997, is a club that provides the Wyomissing Area Junior-Senior High School with closed circuit television announcements. The Wyo 5 Live Club affords students an opportunity to announce and produce daily live broadcasts to the entire JSHS. In addition to creating a live broadcast experience, Wyo 5 Live regularly airs supplemental video produced by Multimedia I, II, and III students.

Hundreds of Wyomissing Area JSHS students have received hands-on public speaking, technical and production experience, and dozens have moved forward with professional careers in the broadcasting industry.

Replacing aging hardware and upgrading the video signal by creating a web-based broadcast is essential. Plans

include purchasing two new high definition cameras and a video switcher that would enable the broadcast signal to stream high definition video to the students. This upgrade gives students a relevant broadcast experience.
