University. Using a template, he had students create passports with their names, travel information, and pictures. From there, students chose three destinations around the world they hope to visit. Stu-

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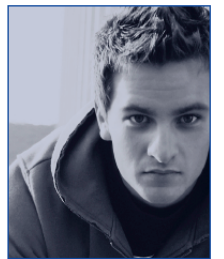

## Wyomissing Area Students: Not Your Typical Teens When it Comes to Fitness!



Many people are aware of the discouraging results from research on childhood obesity and physical fitness. However, national averages do not always accurately represent the populations of individual schools. Such was the case with the results of Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School's 2009-2010 physical fitness testing.

During the 2009-2010 school year, students at the Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School saw an increased emphasis on physical fitness within their physical education units. The physical education department continued to measure students' health-related fitness using the Presidential Physical Fitness Tests. However, this year, students participated in some new units that were designed to specifically target the areas of health-related fitness measured in the Presidential tests. The tests were also incorporated into students' quarterly grades.

Nearly 700 students completed the full series of physical fitness tests, which measure elements

such as: cardiovascular fitness, muscular strength, muscular endurance, flexibility, speed, and agility. As the results of these tests clearly show, the hard work of the students paid off with some truly outstanding results. Listed at right are the percentages of the students who scored above the national averages for the main components of physical fitness.

Additionally, Wyomissing recorded its highest ever total for Presidential Physical Fitness Award Winners. This award is presented to students who score above the 85th percentile on all five physical fitness tests. A total of 95 students earned the Presidential Physical Fitness Award, which is one of the highest percentages of any secondary school in the state of Pennsylvania!

Congratulations to the students of the Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School for their outstanding performances. They continue to demonstrate a commitment to achieving at high levels, both academically and physically.

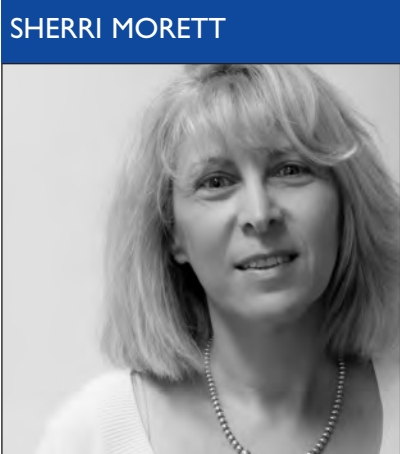

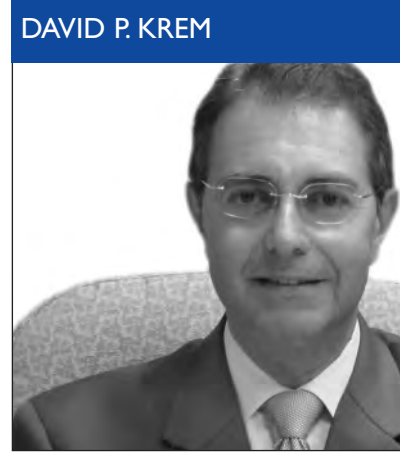

## Wyomissing helps Haiti: Students and Staff Raise More Than \$2,500



During the week of February 15, 2010, the junior and senior high student councils, along with the service club and the environmental club, sponsored a Wyo Helps Haiti fundraiser. Wyomissing Area Jr./Sr. High School raised more than \$200 with Hats for

Haiti and more than \$1,500 with hot chocolate and snacks.

By donating one dollar, students were permitted to wear hats on Friday, with more than 200 students and staff bearing student-designed stickers saying, "I helped." In addition to being a terrific fundraising success, Wyomissing Area demonstrated its ability to utilize the talents of students and school organizations to do its part in helping the Haitian people in this critical hour. 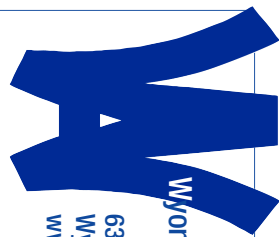
