The Book: For this assignment you may use **UNITED STATES HISTORY** by **AMSCO** all other information can be accessed online using Google. Plan on using that book for this summer assignment and as your independent study all year long. Leave the AMSCO book at home in a secure place that you can access.

Due Date: Ideally, I would love to have this summer assignment by **Friday**, **July 19** so that I can take all projects with me to the beach for one marathon week of grading. I do understand that lots of good things do happen in the summer but I need to have all summer assignments **by no later than MONDAY**, **August 12 (the first week of fall sports practice)**. Late assignments (after due date) will lose 2 points per day of lateness. Extenuating circumstances will receive consideration. Grade: This assignment will carry the weight of a test grade (60 points) or about 15% of your first marking period grade. Additionally, there will be several stimulus-based (primary and secondary source) multiple choice questions and several short answer essay questions from this assignment during the first week of school (an additional 40 points).

Prompts: Most of the challenges (questions) in this summer assignment are set up in a map or graphic organizer format but be sure to give an explanation or description when one is requested. Work may be hand written or word-processed.

This Assignment: Should take you through **Time Period 1** (1491 - 1607) and just into **Time Period 2** (1607 - 1754). There were several questions from this time period on this year's AP U.S. Exam so try to become an "expert" on these times.

Indian Groups - 10 points

1. Read your prep book or use the internet to answer <u>all</u> parts of the following question. Use the outline map provided or make you own to identify the following regional tribal areas: **Eastern Woodland - Plains - Pacific Northwest** and **Great Basin (desert) Indian groups.** Within each region of your map, briefly identify how **climate** and **naturesources** shaped the lifestyle of each diverse American Indian group in such areas as **food**, **dwellings**, level of **urban development** and **technology** prior to European contact.

European Colonial Holding Map - 10 points

2. You may use your prep book or the internet to answer <u>all</u> parts of the following question on your map: Under the policy of **mercantilism**, what region did each European nation claim and what forms of wealth did each country extract from the "New World" colonial holdings? How did each group of European colonizers treat the Native Americans with whom they came in contact? What were the differences in the European colonial patterns.

English Geographic Regions - 5 points + 5 points.

- 3. a. Read your prep book and then check the internet to answer <u>all</u> parts of the following on your map: Identify the **three distinct regions of English colonization** that developed along the east coast of modern America. Within each region, identify how the colonies differed in climate, industry, urban development and in the need for labor.
 - b. Use the internet and Google Jamestown, Virginia (Chesapeake Bay) colony. Then search for Boston, Massachusetts (Massachusetts Bay) colony. While both colonies were English and shared similar cultural bonds they were very different. Write a brief paper (long paragraph) on the differences regarding these two English colonies.


Columbian Exchange and Triangular Trade - 5 points and 5 points

 - b. **Second term** resumption of the Cold War with U.S.S.R., Strategic Defense Initiative (SDI "Star Wars" missile defense system), "Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall!", INF Treaty, demise of the U.S.S.R., Iran-Contra affair.
 - c. Reagan's Legacy.
